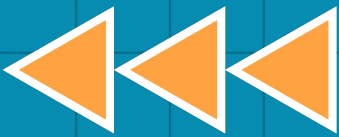


WORSHIP

Worship. It's one of the coolest and most unique ways that we get to interact with God. Throughout the Bible, we get to see stories of people coming together as a community and worshipping God together. Worship is an amazing time to connect with God through Scripture, music and prayer. We get to worship each week we come together for Living Water.

This unit, we'll take a look at worship; what the traditions are that we follow, what it might look like for us, and how God gives us all unique gifts and ways of worshipping. Pastor Jonathan will be leading us in teaching throughout the unit. We will finish this unit with an amazing worship experience for all students and families.





READ SCRIPTURE AND DISCUSS

Together as a group, read today's scripture Psalm 100: 1-5 and Revelation 21: 1-6a. Ask for volunteers who might be willing to read or have a leader read aloud. Take a moment to ask the group for their initial reactions. Lead your group in a discussion using the questions below.

1. What does worship look like for you? Do you worship at church? Do you worship somewhere else? What do you think you need in order to worship?
3. What stuck out to you about what Pastor Jonathan taught tonight?
3. What is something you learned about worshipping from a Bible story that was shared tonight.
4. Is it important to worship together as a community of people? Why or why not?
5. If you connect with worship through music, does it have to be Christian music or a hymn in order for you to worship with it? Why or why not?

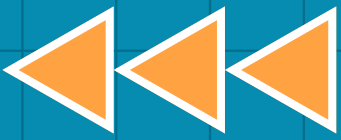
WORKSHEET

Have each student complete the Bible worksheet provided. When each student is done, ask them to share their answers together as a group. Take time for everyone to share their answers and contribute to the conversation.

PEAKS & VALLEYS

During your small group time, give each student the opportunity to share one peak and one valley about their week. If they don't have a high or low for the week, ask them to share something that stood out to them about their week. End in Prayer!





READ SCRIPTURE AND DISCUSS

Together as a group, read today's scripture lesson Acts 2: 38-47. Ask for volunteers who might be willing to read or have a leader read aloud. Take a moment to ask the group for their initial reactions. Lead your group in a discussion using the questions below.

1. What stuck out to you about the Bible story? What did worshipping look like for people in the Bible?
2. What are some worship traditions that you have heard that SOLLC does?
3. What does worship look like for your family? Are there some family traditions that you all have when it comes to worship?
4. How different is our worship from the worship over the early Christians? Why do you think things have changed over time?
5. After talking about different traditions and ways of worshipping, is there a right way to worship? Explain.

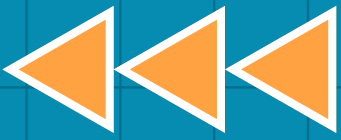
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VILLAGE NIGHT → 3-6-24

Worship

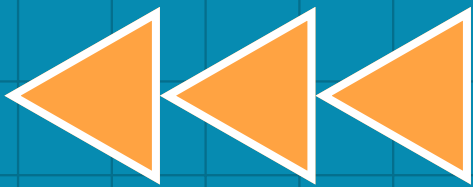
The 7th and 8th grade village groups will meet in the lower great room to create part of the worship service for Family Night.
